

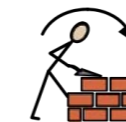

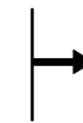

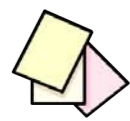


1840

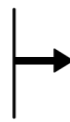
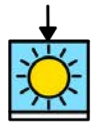


The Ships sailed around England and all over the world.

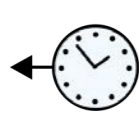
Sailing from Par Harbour stopped in 2008.



Today China Clay is transported from Par Harbour by road.



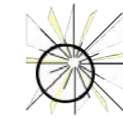
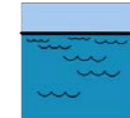
